Connect.

We bring together child advocates from around the country in a community of practice, strategy, inspiration, and mutual support. Peer-to-peer knowledge sharing activities include monthly Partnership Peer Exchange meetings, an annual retreat, affinity groups, and regular Race Equity Leadership meetings.



Invest.

In 2022, the Partnership dedicated over 80% of its budget to re-grants to our members. Grants were focused on:

- Building family financial security
- Advocating for the Child Tax Credit
- Growing parent advocacy



Strengthen.

The Partnership for America's Children supports executive directors of member organizations, and the development of a pipeline of leaders in the child advocacy sector. We facilitate communities of practice focused on child welfare policy (SPARC), Census Bureau policy & resources (Count All Kids), and federal policy solutions to improve opportunities and outcomes for youth who experience foster care (Journey to Success).

Transforming Children's Lives Through Public Policy Solutions.




